Welcome to a new way of managing municipal waste.....

As of April 1st, 2009, a new method of managing municipal waste has been implemented within the Municipal District of Bonnyville boundaries including the City of Cold Lake, the Town of Bonnyville, the Summer Village of Bonnyville Beach and the Summer Village of Pelican Narrows, which is known as the Beaver River Regional Waste Management Commission. All municipal waste is no longer just dumped into a hole in the ground. A transfer station system is now in effect.

What does this mean?

This now means all waste accepted at the site will be going either to the transfer station to be hauled to an approved Class II landfill site, to the Class III landfill site at the transfer site or to the recycling storage or composting compounds.

We must now separate our different waste types before we take it to the transfer site to dispose. The transfer station can only accept municipal solid waste such as household refuse, commercial refuse such as food wastes, non recyclable paper, etc. The Class III landfill accepts only inert solid waste such as construction, demolition and renovation waste, etc. Recyclable materials will be diverted to storage or processing areas.

Consequently, new rules and regulations must now be put in place to efficiently deal with the disposal of waste. The following sheets outline the new rules and regulations which we must now abide by to meet environmental standards and the operation of such facilities as ours.

Please refer to them for further explanation of the procedures and classes of waste that can or cannot be accepted at the transfer site. The scale house attendant or site operator will be most pleased to assist you should you have any questions or require any direction. Please do not hesitate to discuss any concerns you have with them.

TRANSFER STATION RULES AND REGULATIONS

ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE SITE MUST REPORT TO THE SCALE HOUSE ENTERING OR EXITING THE SITE EVEN IF THE PERSON DOES NOT HAVE WASTE

ALL VEHICLES HAULING WASTE MUST BE WEIGHED ON THE WAY IN AND ON THE WAY OUT

- Small children and pets must stay in the vehicle at all times
- Incoming loads must be secured and covered
- Follow instructions of the operator, you must offload different materials at different locations as directed
- Mixed loads are at the discretion of the site operator
- Special handling fee: all waste which requires special handling or equipment. Determination of 'special handling fee' is at the discretion of the site operator
- All loads will be subject to random load inspections, i.e., anyone can be checked at any time

All waste accepted at the site will be going either to the transfer station; the Class III landfill or recycle storage compounds. As such the facility can only accept non-hazardous wastes as defined by the Activities Designation Regulation and Waste Control Regulation. We are also governed by the rules and regulations of the accepting landfill of our wastes. Therefore the facility can only accept the following types of waste:

AT THE TRANSFER STATION

Tipping Fee

Commission member - \$141.00 per tonne (\$0.14 per kg)

Non-commission member - \$185.00 per tonne

ACCEPTED WASTE

- Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) including residential, commercial and institutional waste. Examples would be household refuse, commercial refuse including food wastes, non recyclable paper, plastics, small non recyclable metals, glass, easily airborne plastic or paper films, bags or sheets, other similar type refuse.
- Non-hazardous industrial **solid** wastes, as long as it is deemed to be non-hazardous as defined by AEPEA and the Waste Control Regulation.

- Other waste as directed by the scale house attendant

PROHIBITED WASTE

- Waste defined as hazardous by AEPEA and the Waste Control Regulation
- Biomedical waste
- Radioactive waste
- Explosives
- Bulk liquids, including sump wastes
- Specified Risk Materials (SRM)
- Ashes and burn barrel waste
- Asbestos
- Propane containers
- Inert wastes that can be accepted at the Class III landfill

To be in compliance with our accepting landfill and avoid disposal surcharges, we must abide by their rules and regulations. Consequently, the following rules also apply to the Transfer Station:

The following wastes cannot be accepted as mixed loads and must be sorted and disposed of at the appropriate disposal or storage compound. All unsorted loads will not be allowed to dump at the transfer station:

- Dry waste (as defined above) mixed with wet waste
- Metal mixed in with wet waste
- Tires mixed in with wet waste
- Oily containers mixed in with wet waste
- Any recyclable items mixed with wet waste
- Wire or cable mixed in with wet waste
- Bulk liquids
- Any hazardous waste in the load
- Any sealed containers (containers must have tops open and empty of liquid)

AT THE CLASS III LANDFILL

Tipping Fee

As per attached rate sheet

ACCEPTED WASTE

- Inert Solid Waste including construction, renovation and demolition waste

- Dry waste (shingles, concrete, furniture, dry wall, non asbestos insulation, etc.)
- Wood; Note: wood cannot be chemically treated. Chemically treated wood must go to the transfer station for disposal at the Class II landfill.

PROHIBITED WASTE

- Municipal solid waste
- Grass and leaves yard waste
- Dead animals and SRM
- Chemically treated wood

AT THE RECYCLING COMPOUNDS

The following wastes may be accepted for storage for recycling purposes and will be directed to the appropriate designated storage or processing areas:

- E-waste
- Automobiles and parts
- Household appliances (charge for CFC removal)
- Mixed metals
- Automotive batteries
- Used tires
- Waste oil and oil containers
- Paint and paint containers
- Yard waste and other composting material, Cold Lake Only

Please check with scale house attendant for Class III landfill prohibitions.
